## From The Director's Chair

**“HO, HO, HO, \_\_\_\_\_ !”**

**(Reuse of State Surplus Makes PA Greener)**

If you have watched much TV and you are of a certain age (like me,) you can likely complete that slogan.

Of course, it is “Green Giant” made famous as the brand of the popular vegetable processing company.

Well, I am writing today to tell you about another, smaller, **green giant**, the Bureau of Supplies and Surplus Operations. I believe that we can lay claim to that title because of our mission, the longevity of our programs, and the breadth of our customer base in regards to sustainability and the “*Greening of PA.*” It only recently dawned on me just how far ahead of their time lawmakers were who first envisioned starting a surplus property operation.

The main mission of State Surplus Program is re-utilization. Before any asset is offered for sale, our State Surplus Property Division makes it available to all other agencies in the Commonwealth. By law, we are compelled to seek the most complete consumption of a property's useful life. So instead of simply ordering a new filing cabinet and chucking the old one in the dumpster, we strive to find someone first within the state who can re-utilize that old filing cabinet. From a global perspective, that not only prevents over-landfilling, it also avoids consumption of new ores and steel, energy to melt and form drawers, packaging, energy and pollution associated with transportation and so on. When you consider the taxpayer expense avoided from the potentially unnecessary expense of a new filing cabinet, this is a “Win-Win-Win” (take that, you overgrown bag of peas).

In addition, the State Surplus Program makes surplus PennDOT heavy equipment available to local municipalities via a private auction. We administer the state's recycling contracts for waste batteries, motor oil, antifreeze, paper, metals, and tires. Local municipalities can piggy-back on these contracts. This will serve to increase volume and drive up prices as vendors compete for our burgeoning business.

State surplus has sold spent brass ammunition cartridges as both scrap brass and as “once fired brass.” By segmenting the market, we targeted (pun intended) reloading supply dealers and were able to return approximately 40% more for the State Police. Promoting reloading saved the environmental costs to manufacture and deliver new brass cartridges and the higher price went to bolster police activities.

In much the same way, our Federal Surplus Property Program might be considered an “*olive drab*” giant. Military and civilian federal surplus is donated to eligible organizations for pennies on the dollar (saving a lot of taxpayer green). The use conditions mandated by the General Services Administration promote sustainability. Normally, goods must be put into use within one year, and must be used for one year before title passes from the federal government to the donee. Most goods are used, but not all.

I would like to point out that our TSA property sales avoid landfilling by successfully marketing voluntarily surrendered airport property on eBay. Numerous types of overrun building construction and other raw materials are available including marble, sheet and plate steel, metal and plastic pipe, metal doors, utility poles, etc. We are currently negotiating for seven truckloads of bottled water, well within expiration date, left unused from federal disaster response.

One of the really neat features of the Federal Surplus Property Program is cannibalization. The rules do permit (with prior permission) donees to acquire two identical “bad” assets in order to build one good one.

“Too often, procurement officers and their staffs find it easier to shop from a catalog when making their purchases,” said Kathleen McGinty, secretary of the state Department of Environmental Protection. “As government entities, we have a responsibility to be good stewards of the commonwealth’s limited resources. As a society, we have an obligation to protect for future generations the natural resources with which we’ve been blessed.

“DGS’s surplus property programs create value for the state by making it easier to find new life for quality products. This is a model of sustainability. It conserves production materials, and eliminates the demand for energy needed to manufacture and transport new products.”

Many of you may have noted that in the last year we switched from run-of-the-mill white property labels to a vibrant green. Coincidence? I think not. So next time you are discussing ways to green your agency, community, or organization, please remember to check in with the little **green giant**.

Many of our forms are now available online, and can be completed and submitted online. Trees throughout Pennsylvania applaud this effort. If you are a new organization interested in becoming a Federal Surplus Property Program donee, our [Eligibility Application](#) is available online. If you are already a member, and your organization is looking for a specific item or has a wish list of items, you can complete our [Wants List Request Form](#) online. If you are a law enforcement agency, correctional facility, or drug task force and you would like to take advantage of the reduced pricing through Federal contracts, you can use our [1122 Price Request Form](#) online.

On a more obvious note, this publication is exceedingly green. Remember the days when we published the newsletter on a quarterly basis? The information wasn’t particularly timely, as it was a six-week

process from the time I wrote the articles and the ads until the time the newsletter was actually printed. We printed approximately 5,000 copies of each issue. In order to reduce mailing costs, we would send only one issue to each organization, but even then, we printed 3,500 mailing labels. For those of you busy doing the math, the remaining 1,500 copies of the newsletter were distributed through our attendance at conferences and speaking engagements. Believe me when I say that my back is extremely grateful for this particular green initiative.

Now, you can receive as many copies of this information as are needed by your organization. The information is timely and frequent—hopefully not too frequent! We “send” approximately 6,500 newsletters these days, with another 1,000 or so sent via fax to those organizations lacking an email address. **As a reminder, if you are receiving this newsletter by fax, and you do have an email address, [please contact us with the email address](#).** You will receive your information in a more timely manner, and Pennsylvania’s trees will thank you.

In State Surplus, utilizing Asset Auctions to conduct our Municipal Bid Sales online is a major green initiative, not only in the number of trees saved by not mailing out paper bids, but also in the number of municipalities able to participate in the auction, view the equipment ahead of time, and **save money** all at the same time!

And, beginning March 1, the State Surplus Store and eBay will accept credit card payments. Federal Surplus donees may also use credit cards to cover service charges, provided that the credit card is issued in the name of the organization. Think of all the trees you will save by not having to write checks for your already-green purchases!

Our programs can save you time, money, and effort with all of your purchasing needs, proving that the grass is always greener with the Commonwealth’s Surplus, Excess, and New Property Programs.

**Blue Mountain Academy (Berks County)** acquired 24 wash basins which will be used for communion basins throughout this religious academy. The basins, originally valued at \$5,464.70 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$150.00. Academy officials estimate a savings to their students and parents or approximately \$1,300.00.

**Quincy Township (Franklin County)** acquired three Travel Trailers which will be used for job site trailers for the Township. The trailers, originally valued at \$55,000.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$9,750.00. Township officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$6,500.00.

**Pennsylvania Dutch Council, Boy Scouts of America (Lancaster County)** acquired a large projector which will be used in training youth and adults in various areas including safety programs and first aid courses. The projector, originally valued at \$6,000.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$125.00. Scout officials estimate a cost savings to their Scouts of approximately \$400.00.

**Armstrong County (Armstrong County)** acquired a Travel Trailer which will be used as a mobile command post for ARM NET operations, DUI Sobriety Check Points, and select criminal investigations. The trailer, originally valued at \$17,954.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$1,200.00. County officials estimate a cost savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$3,000.00.

**Meyersdale Borough (Somerset County)** acquired an action jack which will be used in the borough shops and garages to lift trucks and tractors for repair and inspections. The jack, originally valued at \$5,924.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$325.00. Borough officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$300.00.

**Meyersdale Borough (Somerset County)** acquired a Dump Truck and a self contained Leaf Vacuum unit. The Dump Truck will be used as one of the Borough service trucks hauling stone and black top. The truck, originally valued at \$36,382.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$1,795.00. Borough officials estimate a cost savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$7,000.00.

The self contained Leaf Vacuum will be used to clean leaves from the streets and storm drains. The vacuum, originally valued at \$18,975.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$1,750.00. Borough officials estimate a cost savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$5,500.00.
