From The Director's Chair

Yet again the limelight is shining brightly on DGS/BSSO. The DGS Press Secretary's article, mentioned last month, was picked by many local papers (Pittsburgh Post-Gazette, Harrisburg Patriot News, Scranton Times-Tribune, Wilkes Barre Times Leader, Williamsport Sun-Gazette, Pocono Record, and The Centre Daily Times). DGS Secretary Jim Creedon appeared on CNBC's "On the Money" on Thursday, August 10 speaking about voluntarily surrendered property. I will appear on WGAL-TV 8 (Lancaster) on Tuesday, August 15. The Associated Press carried two different stories (one statewide and one national) about our airport property operation this past weekend. We have been able to add four new airports to our list of suppliers (Trenton, NJ; Jamestown, NY; Nantucket, MA; Johnstown, PA). Next time you are here, you might want to pick up a "souvenir" (or bid for one on eBay – seller id 'pastatesurplus'). If you are really nice, I might even autograph it for you! ☺

The Bureau has been actively assisting with [flood relief](#). The Bureau was successful in securing "Priority Screening" of surplus property with both the General Services Administration and the Defense Reutilization Marketing Services. This means that our Bureau will have second choice behind only other Federal agencies. Next month, Scott will provide some details in his column on who we have been able to assist and how. If you need surplus goods for flood relief and have not yet sent us a list of property, please do so immediately. At this time, we have not been informed how long our priority status will remain in effect.

Please note some bigtime technological breakthroughs at BSSO. Both our Federal & State surplus property systems have been upgraded to permit us to attach digital photos to our on-line inventory. So now, when you look up to see what we have in inventory, in addition to the written description, you will now see a photo. For state surplus, this will only be accessible by Commonwealth property control officers. However, for Federal Surplus the inventory and photos are available to all our potential customers via internet access. Naturally, it will take some time to populate the entire inventory with photos, so bear with us. We are snapping pic's on all newly arrived goods, so you will see a photo on anything new or recent. At this time, we are limited to just one photo. However, this is clearly a step in the right direction, 'cuz you know what they say. A picture is worth a thousand words.

We are really pushing hard to get ready for the Auction Blowout. It has been a tremendous undertaking planning and coordinating multiple auctions back-to-back. Joe Angelo, Mary Beth Engren, and Mike Stephens (new PA Management Associate in training) have been working diligently to insure that it the sale is full of bargains that you can easily take advantage of. I hope that you will be able to attend at least one of the sales as this promises to be the highlight of our selling season.

Check out the latest details on our Fixed Price Vehicle Program. Looks like we will be able to broadcast preliminary vehicle lists 2 weeks **before** the cars are turned over to the auctioneer. If

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you see something of interest, let us know. We will pursue getting complete information and set up a private screening. This change will give you information two weeks earlier, hopefully providing time for you to secure preliminary approvals/funding. It also precludes us from having to guess what vehicles will be of interest and when.

Finally, I regret to inform you of the loss of one of our greatest resources. On Friday, July 21, Levi Hite, passed away. Levi worked as a Federal Surplus Property Agent (screener) serving both the Harrisburg and Hermitage warehouses and customers. Levi had just retired on July 14. While we will fill the position, we will never be able to replace Levi. His dedication, knowledge, and affable personality will be difficult to match or surpass. Please join us in wishing Levi "Godspeed" and helping to whomever has the unenviable job of trying to fill those big shoes.

Equipment Recently Acquired by Your Neighbors...

North Whitehall Township (Lehigh County), acquired a Tennant sweeper/cleaner which will be used to keep the floors clean in the new Township garage. The sweeper, originally valued at \$30,000.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$7,500.00. Township officials estimate a savings of approximately \$8,000.00 to their taxpayers.

Pennsylvania Department of Corrections (Cumberland County), acquired two (2) wooden executive desks which will be used to replace current desks in the staff office. The desks, originally valued at \$7,200.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$100.00. Department officials estimate a savings to Commonwealth taxpayers of approximately \$7,100.00.

Pennsylvania Department of Corrections (Cumberland County), acquired a commercial paper shredder to be used to dispose of confidential information. The shredder, originally valued at \$5,000.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$100.00. Department officials estimate a savings to Commonwealth taxpayers of approximately \$4,900.00.

Pottsville Area School District (Schuylkill County), acquired a concrete saw which will be used to repair several concrete areas in the District. The saw, originally valued at \$5,000.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$375.00. District officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$4,700.00.

New Britain Borough (Bucks County), acquired seven (7) automatic pistols that will be issued to their police officers as duty weapons. These pistols, originally valued at \$4,375.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$245.00. Borough officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$3,500.00.

Harrisburg Area Community College (Dauphin County), acquired 238 urinals. These urinals, originally valued at \$59,549.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$5,950.00. College officials estimate a savings to their institution of approximately \$33,000.

Susquehanna Township (Dauphin County), acquired two (2) Dell Pentium laptop computers which will be used for a mobile data terminal in a police car and to map software. These computers, originally valued at \$4,800.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$350.00. Township officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$4,500.00.

Franklin County Career and Technology Center (Franklin County), received a dust collector to be used in their welding shop as a portable system when they have a project to weld in the

middle of their shop. The unit, originally valued at \$5,712.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$225.00. School officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$5,000.00.

Pennsylvania Department of Welfare – Danville State Hospital (Montour County), acquired an Armstrong commercial air conditioning unit which will be used to replace an old air conditioning unit in one of their consumer areas. The unit, originally valued at \$10,200.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$500.00. Department officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$9,700.00.

Pennsylvania Trolley Museum, Inc (Washington County), acquired a portable air compressor unit which will be used by volunteers to construct additional trolley tracks at the Museum, which was featured in last month's newsletter! The compressor, originally valued at \$7,480.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$1,800.00. Museum officials estimate a savings to their facility of approximately \$4,000.00.

Mayfield Borough (Lackawanna County), acquired 60 commercial kitchen knives and ladles which will be used by the Borough Fire Company at their fund raisers. The knives and ladles, originally valued at \$6,000.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$90.00. Borough officials estimate the cost savings to their taxpayers to be approximately \$500.00.

Shalom Christian Academy (Franklin County), acquired 19 Dell desktop computers which will be used in new computer labs for the middle and high school. The computers, originally valued at \$28,538.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$1,805.00. Academy officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$6,000.00.

Bradford City (McKean County), acquired two (2) Dell laptop computers that will be used for their city clerk's office. These computers, originally valued at \$5,445.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$400.00. City officials are pleased to announce an approximate cost savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$2,000.00.

Air Heritage of Western Pennsylvania Air Museum (Beaver County), acquired a UH-1E Helicopter with engine that will become part of their flying museum. The aircraft industry has strong roots in Western Pennsylvania. This helicopter, originally valued at \$200,000.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$2,500.00. Museum officials announced a cost savings to the Museum of approximately \$53,000.00.

Donegal Township (Westmoreland County), acquired two (2) cargo trucks that will be used as both snow plow trucks and maintenance trucks. These vehicles, originally valued at over \$62,000 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$800.00. Township officials have announced a cost savings to their taxpayers to be approximately \$40,000.00.

Mount Oliver Borough (Allegheny County), acquired three (3) mobile light towers that will be used for fire and emergency operations in the Borough. These light towers, originally valued at \$19,800.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$6,000.00. Borough officials estimate a cost savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$30,000.00.

McCandless Township Sanitary Authority (Allegheny County), acquired a concrete saw and a mobile light unit. The concrete saw will be used to repair existing concrete, while the light unit

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will be used for night emergency repairs. These items, originally valued at \$20,000.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$4,550.00. The Authority estimates a savings to their customers and taxpayers of approximately \$15,000.00.

Impact Services Corporation (Philadelphia County), acquired a large quantity of clothing for their homeless veterans which will be used to clothe the homeless men off the streets of Philadelphia. This lot of clothing, originally valued at \$10,317.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$150.00. The shelter officials estimate a savings to their organization of approximately \$2,000.00.

Pennsylvania Civil Air Patrol Inc (Lebanon County), acquired ten body bags for use with their corporate vehicle in time of emergency. These bags, originally valued at \$5,637.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$80.00. CAP officials estimate a savings to the taxpayers of Pennsylvania of approximately \$300.00.

Western Pa Operating Engineers Joint Apprentice and Training Program (Westmoreland County), acquired a large mobile crane to be used for training their apprentice engineers and operators. The crane, originally valued at \$221,351.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$5,000.00. Officials of the Training Program estimate the savings to their Program to be approximately \$15,000.00.

Centre Township (Berks County), acquired a commercial warehouse sweeper which will be used for sweeping Township roads. Township officials are pleased to report that they have been able to actually cut taxes this year because of using the Federal Surplus Property Program. This sweeper, originally valued at \$24,044.00, was acquired for a service charge of only \$1,100.00. Officials in the Township estimate a cost savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$15,000.00.

Antioch Incorporated (Dauphin County), acquired ten (10) tungsten palm pilots that will be used to give to their staff for storing important information. These units, originally valued at \$4,990.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$500.00. Organization officials estimate a savings to their consumers of approximately \$4,000.00.

South Creek Township Civil Defense (Bradford County), acquired an AC engine generator. This generator will be used for their Township garage. The generator, originally valued at \$6,338.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$100.00.

Lancaster County Career and Technology Center (Lancaster County), acquired two (2) exam tables which will be used in their nursing assistant training program. These tables, originally valued at \$6,000.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$300.00. School officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$5,700.00.

Fixed Price Vehicles

I have been keeping you up to date with our ongoing plans with the General Services Administration (GSA) and changes coming to help increase our services to you through the Fixed Priced Sales Vehicle Program.

After some discussion as to how we could best serve the taxpayers of Pennsylvania, we decided to begin sending lists via email of vehicles currently available through the Fixed Price Sales Vehicle Program with prices attached. If your organization is interested in a listed vehicle, we will make the arrangements for you to see the vehicle before making your final decision. GSA has imposed a tight time frame for this program, so you will need to make an immediate decision when you screen the vehicle in order to generate an invoice. In most cases, you will have about two weeks to make the initial decision and then two weeks to remove the vehicle after you physically screen and pay for it. We hope that this policy will result in getting the best vehicles possible for your organization at the best prices. Look for the first list soon.

Please remember to get your requests into us as soon as possible if you are interested in low mileage, quality late model cars, trucks, vans, and even heavy equipment. We are ready to work with your requests as we receive future lists of vehicles. Weapons Inspections Now Due!

The Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Executive Director of Distribution and Reutilization Policy has directed all State Coordinators that were issued Weapons under their State's Law Enforcement Property Program to conduct a 100% inventory of all weapons. Further, this action must be completed no later than 15 September 2006. If your Law Enforcement Agency has received weapons through the Pennsylvania Law Enforcement Property Program, you will receive a call from our office over the next week to schedule a physical inventory visit. Even if you have had a physical inspection recently, you will be inspected again per the instructions from DLA. This policy further stipulates that 25% of the total weapons issued must be inventoried every quarter of the year, beginning 1 October 2006. Future inventory inspections may be done through the mail, using a standard letter that we will issue to your organization. [Surplus Vehicle Auction](#) - The Bureau of Vehicle Management conducts periodic auctions of state-owned vehicles. Auctions are held at the Keystone Auto Auction, and are open to the general public.

[State Surplus Property Program](#) (other than vehicles) - Our State Surplus Property Program offers state-owned equipment and supplies for sale to the general public, either through our Distribution Center in Harrisburg, at special sales held periodically throughout the state, our online auctions with Asset Auctions, or through eBay. We also offer bid sales for municipalities on heavy equipment and annual contract bids for vendors on recyclable materials.

[Federal Surplus Property Program](#) - Our Federal Surplus Property Program is available to nonprofit, tax-exempt organizations that operate an educational or health program, as well as to governmental agencies and political subdivisions. Federally-owned equipment and supplies are donated to eligible organizations. Participants incur a service charge that covers the administrative costs of the program.

[Fixed Price Sales Vehicles Program](#) - Our Fixed Price Sales Vehicles Program is available to any organization qualified to receive Federal Surplus Property. Our Program is authorized to purchase fleet vehicles from the General Services Administration before they reach public auction, and pass the savings along to your organization.

[Law Enforcement 1033 Excess Property Program](#) - Our Excess Property Program is restricted to Law Enforcement Agencies only. Such agencies, possessing the powers of arrest and apprehension, can acquire a vast array of line-of-duty items. The federally-owned equipment is donated to the Law Enforcement Agency, with a minimal service charge to cover the administrative costs of the program.

[Law Enforcement 1122 New Property Program](#) - Our New Property Program is, most accurately, a Federal Cooperative Purchasing Program. It is restricted to Law Enforcement Agencies, and those Emergency Services using Federal Fire Grant monies to acquire new equipment and supplies. Such agencies are able to purchase these materials using select federal contracts. These contracts offer law enforcement property suitable for counter drug use.

[Warehouse and Distribution Division](#) - It is the responsibility of the Department of General Services, through the Bureau of Supplies and Surplus Operations, to establish and maintain the procedures for the disbursement of all materials located within the Warehouse and Distribution Division.

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


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
