## MIXED BAGS



Please be advised that eBay is forcing a change to our (and lots of sellers) standard terms of sale. In an attempt to push buyers and sellers toward use of its proprietary Paypal financial instrument, beginning in "late October", eBay will no longer permit sellers to accept checks or money orders as payment for goods shipped direct to buyers. Sellers will still be able to accept checks (for us-certified ONLY), money orders, and cash only when it is agreed that goods are to be paid for at pickup. Because the date specified by eBay is so mushy, we have elected to begin implementation with lots that will close on or after October 1. With almost no customers using these soon-to-be-restricted payment options on a repeat basis, we are hopeful that the impact is minimal.

We began the significantly revised Fixed Price Vehicle Program in earnest in August. The revision permits us to buy, on speculation, up to \$50,000 worth of vehicles each month. This was permitted due to the extreme limitations imposed by GSA in terms of sale notification, time for inspection, decision-making, and payment. I noted that we received five really low mileage trucks and SUV's in great shape for municipal use. You will remember that we are focusing on low mileage/good condition vehicles to get you the biggest bang for your dollar. My understanding is that two of the five sold within a few days of arrival. Please check out Scott Pepperman's column for photos and all the details. I want to thank those of you who attended Senator Wonderling and Representative Quinn's Local Government and EMS Grants Workshops in Kintnersville on August 7. The programs were very well attended and we were able to help several organizations immediately after making contact. Our next engagement will be in Biglersville, Adams County at the Volunteer Fire Department on Wednesday, October 15. The workshop is being jointly sponsored by Representative Dan Moul and Representative Steven Nickol. Come on out and let me know what you are in need of.

Joe Angelo and the State Surplus Division have some big doings that they are working on. The final PennDOT heavy equipment auction of the year is already under way. Currently state agencies have until Tuesday,

September 16<sup>th</sup> to request a transfer of surplus property. The private, on-line, municipal sale then runs from Wednesday, September 17<sup>th</sup> through Wednesday, October 1<sup>st</sup>. Finally, the on-line public sale will take place beginning Monday, October 14<sup>th</sup> and ending on Wednesday, October 22<sup>nd</sup>. For the public sale, most of the goods will be available for preview October 20<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup> at PennDOT's Western PA Training Facility located at 449 Crawford Run Road in Cheswick, Allegheny County. There are 201 pieces up for bidding.

The highlights include 16 rollers, 2 backhoes, 2 belt loaders, 4 crew cabs, 3 excavators, 7 graders, 4 kettles, 17 loaders, 18 single axle dumps, 28 tandem axle dumps, 1 tri-axle dump, 5 mowers, and an assortment of special purpose machines, parts, and shop equipment. Joe Angelo also just came back from previewing the anticipated surplus property at the DPW Mayview State Hospital in Bridgeville, Allegheny County. Joe reports a wealth of medical laboratory equipment and ceramic's processing (kilns, molds, glazes, etc) will be declared surplus in the spring of 2009. Stay tuned.

There have been a number of personnel changes at the Bureau in the last month. We wish farewell and good luck to Joan Wenerick from the Warehouse & Distribution Division and to Patrick Francisco who has helping us out on a part time basis in Marketing. Joan moved on to the Dept of Health and Patrick has left the employ of the Commonwealth. I would like to welcome Dustin Page to the Elmerton Warehouse and Wayne Cooley to the Federal Surplus Property Program. ## National Association of State Agencies for Surplus Property

Over the years I have talked a great deal to you our donees about the National Association and many of you are Associate Members receiving additional Program information on a regular basis from the Association. Recently I had the honor to attend the Summer National meeting for the Association. While there I took mandatory Civil Rights training, learned about a new initiative from NASA as the Space Shuttle is decommissioned and the possibility about property becoming available for our donees. I also had the opportunity to network with my colleagues from other states to learn about new ideas they are employing and how they may improve the Program here in Pennsylvania. I heard update briefings from both the General Services Administration and the Department of Defense about subjects that will improved the Program here in Pennsylvania and allow us to serve our donees better. Finally I am proud to say that Pennsylvania was the recipient of two national awards. The awards were the first place award for the number of Associate Members, thanks to you our donees who participate and from the General Services Administration, the 2008 Award for Special Achievement in the Federal Surplus Property Donation Program. The credit for both awards goes to the staff here in the Pennsylvania Federal Surplus Property Program. Not only did they represent themselves well to the other Programs around the country but they represented Pennsylvania.



## Items Recently Acquired by Your Neighbors!

**Pennsylvania State Police (Dauphin County)** recently acquired a Clark tug tractor from the Federal Surplus Property Program which will be used for their Aviation Program to move aircraft. The Federal government originally paid \$23,409.36 for the tractor, but the State Police were able to acquire the tractor for a service and handling charge of just \$750.00. State Police officials estimate a cost savings for Commonwealth taxpayers of approximately \$8,000.00.

**Philadelphia City (Philadelphia County)** just acquired a travel trailer from the Program which will be used as a Command Center for City special events such as the Broad Street Run. The Federal government originally paid \$18,500.00 for this trailer, but the City was able to acquire it for a service and handling charge of only \$1,850.00. City officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$25,000.00.

**Shalom Christian Academy (Franklin County)** recently acquired 7 desktop computers and 5 computer monitors which will be used in their current classrooms. The Federal government originally bought the computers for a total price of \$28,750.00 however the Academy was able to acquire all of the computers for a service and handling fee of just \$383.75! Academy officials estimate a cost savings to their students of approximately \$500.00.

**Pottsville City Housing Authority (Schuylkill County)** just acquired a travel trailer through the Federal Surplus Property Program which will be used for additional office space for the Authority. The Federal government originally paid \$18,500.00 for this trailer but the Authority was able to acquire it for a service and handling fee of just \$1,850.00. Authority officials estimate a cost savings for their taxpayers of approximately \$5,000.00.

**Lancaster County Career and Technology Center (Lancaster County)** recently acquired both a crank shaft and some sheet metal from the Program. The crank shaft will be used in the diesel engine repair class to teach students how to use precision measuring tools; the sheet metal will be used to teach students welding. The Federal government originally paid a total of \$24,700.00 for these items; however the Technology Center was able to acquire these items for a total service and handling charge of just \$368.00. The Technology Center officials estimate a cost savings to their students of approximately \$2300.00.

**Emmaus Borough (Lehigh County)** just received 3 travel trailers from the Program which will be used as office space at their training facility and also in coordination with their County animal Response Team (LVCART) as a staging shelter for animals in the event of a disaster in their geographic area. The Federal government originally paid a total service charge for these three trailers of \$55,000.00 but the Borough was able to acquire all three travel trailers for a service and handling fee of just \$5,550.00. Borough officials estimate a cost savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$25,000.00.

## States and local agencies must comply with the provisions of this Rule by November 24, 2008!

On November 18, 2006 the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) added part 634, Worker Visibility to Title 23, Code of Federal Regulation. The purpose of this change is to decrease the likelihood of worker fatalities or injuries caused by motor and construction vehicles and equipment while working within the right-of-way- on Federal-aid highways.

The Rule state that all workers within the right-of-way of a Federal-aid highway who are exposed either to traffic or to construction equipment within the work area shall wear high-visibility safety apparel. This apparel must meet the Performance Class 2 or 3 requirements of the ANSI/ISEA 107-2004 publication *American National Standard for High-Visibility Safety Apparel and Headwear*.

“Workers” are defined as people on foot whose duties place them within the right-of-way of a Federal-aid highway, such as highway construction and maintenance crews, survey crews, utility crews, responders to incidents within the highway right-of-way, ad law enforcement personnel when directing traffic, investigating crashes, and handling lane closures, obstructed roadways, and disasters. States and other agencies must comply with the provisions of this Rule by November 24, 2008.
