From The Director's Chair

Our latest media appearances have included BBC-TV and BBC-Radio on May 9; Scranton Times-Tribune on April 19; a front page in the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette on April 24; and a press release on May 31. You can check out the stories by following the links from our [“In The News”](#) web page.

We just learned that Senate bill 1992 is now before the Appropriations Committee. This legislation would double the maximum DCED loan amount for municipalities purchasing equipment from \$25k to \$50k and for facilities from \$50k to \$100k. This program is referred to as the Local Government Capital Project Loan Program and is applicable to communities with a population UNDER 12,000. Loans are at 2% interest. We will continue to keep you posted.

State Surplus is busy getting the year's first Penndot heavy equipment auction underway. They also have a full slate of sales in progress or on the books for DPW regional hospitals. Check out Joe Angelo's column for all the details.

You will recall from last month's issue that I attended the Fire and EMS Show in Kittanning. It was a great show and remarkably well attended for a Saturday. One of the messages that I received loud and clear was to provide extended hours at the Federal Surplus Western Warehouse (Hermitage, Mercer County). Please check out Scott Pepperman's column for an important announcement regarding this topic.

There has been a tremendous amount of activity and improvements in our Warehouse & Distribution Division. The following information relates primarily to our **State Agency Customers**.

- We would like to welcome six new customers to our service family – the Department of Community and Economic Development, the Department of Education, the Environmental Hearing Board, the PA Securities Commission, the Local Government Commission, and DGS's own Property Management Storeroom.
- Next month, we will be facilitating consolidation of DPW's Air Quality Unit at one of our facilities.
- We are working with J-Net to provide storage to agencies dislocated by the closure of M/A Com's radio warehouse in Harrisburg.
- Ken Clemence and his team have been working with Commonwealth Information Technologists to develop a new SAP picklist printing transaction. This new transaction will now print backordered items on shipping documents. The information is crucial so that requisitioners know that items were not missed being picked and shipped, but that agency inventory was insufficient to cover their entire need. The enhanced visibility facilitates communication between end user and agency materials coordinators to choose the best course of action. The new transaction is identified as ZMMPPS. A full release will be posted on our website in the near future, in addition to direct mail notification to SAP users.

Doings and Happenings

As the Department of Public Welfare continues to realign and reposition its facilities for future service to the citizens of the Commonwealth, the DGS State Surplus Property Division is tasked with redeploying its “sellable assets” to other Commonwealth agencies, as well as planning for future sales of these assets.

Additionally, as we prepare for our Western Heavy Equipment Public Auction for PennDOT, I am extremely happy to report that this has been our most successful municipal auction to date. So many of you have taken advantage of the privilege of bidding before we open up to the public that quite a few of our “premium pieces” - graders, loaders, dump trucks—have found a new home with approximately 17 different municipalities. Overall, 25 municipalities participated, resulting in a gross revenue of **\$210,450**.

Equipment Recently Acquired by Your Neighbors...

Mifflin County Regional Police Department (Mifflin County), acquired six (6) Pentium II laptop computers from the Program. The laptops will be used in patrol cars for producing reports. The laptops, originally valued at \$18,000.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of approximately \$60.00. Department officials estimate a savings to County taxpayers of approximately \$6,000.00.

Donegal Township (Westmoreland County), acquired an arc welding machine and a compressor from the Program for use in bridge repair in the township. The items, originally valued at \$14,000.00 by the Federal Government, were acquired for a service charge of approximately \$225.00. Township officials estimate a savings to the taxpayers of \$10,000.00.

McCandless Township Sewer Authority (Allegheny County), acquired a mobile lift jack for use in lifting vehicles off the ground in their garage to enable their mechanic to work under the vehicles. The jack, originally valued at \$23,372.00 by the Federal Government, was acquired for a service charge of approximately \$2,000.00. Authority officials estimate a savings to their customers of \$18,000.00.

Pennsylvania Department of Corrections (Cumberland County), acquired 57 rotary office chairs through the Program. The chairs will be used to supplement the SCI at Camp Hill, the SCI at Pine Grove and the Superintendent's Office. The chairs, originally valued at \$21,000.00 by the Federal Government, were acquired for a service charge of approximately \$1567.00. Department officials estimate a tax savings on this acquisition of \$3,850.00.

Lower Nazareth Township (Northampton County), acquired a blast cleaning cabinet from the Program. The cabinet will be used to maintain rebuild equipment for the Township. The cabinet, originally valued at \$7,000.00 by the Federal Government, was acquired for a service charge of approximately \$500.00. Township officials estimate a savings of \$500.00.

Ecumenical Community of Harrisburg, Inc. (Dauphin County) acquired miscellaneous computer equipment consisting of CPU's, keyboards, cables, monitors, and mice from the Federal Surplus Program. The computer equipment will be serviced and refurbished and then used for training throughout schools in Greater Harrisburg. The equipment, originally valued at \$18,500.00 by the Federal Government, was acquired for a service charge of approximately \$250.00. The organization estimates their savings at approximately \$5,000.00.

Wayside Christian School (Berks County), acquired four units of wire rope from the Program to use for pulling heavy equipment and removing an old safe. The rope, originally valued at

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\$7,624.00 by the Federal Government, was acquired for a service charge of approximately \$400.00. School officials estimate a savings of approximately \$900.00.

Thiel College (Mercer County), acquired two wooden desks from the Federal Surplus Program to use for two different offices of professors. The desks, originally valued at \$6,600.00 by the Federal Government, were acquired for a service charge of approximately \$100.00. School officials estimate a savings of approximately \$800.00.

Oliver Township (Mifflin County), acquired 54 pieces of brand new culvert pipe through the Federal Surplus Program. The pipe will be used to build a county road beside a stream that needs contained. The pipe, originally valued at \$5,423.00 by the Federal Government, was acquired for a service charge of approximately \$1620.00. Township officials estimate a savings to taxpayers of approximately \$3,000.00.

Cen-Clear Child Services, Inc (Clearfield County) acquired a whisper chopper through the Federal Surplus Property Program. The chopper will be used at their building facilities for cutting the grass. The chopper, originally valued at \$10,000.00 by the Federal Government, was acquired for a service charge of approximately \$4,000.00. Organization officials estimate a savings of approximately \$10,000.00.

Community Life Team, Inc (Dauphin County) acquired an electric utility cart to use for medical standby in such venues as the Pennsylvania Farm Show and City Island. The cart, originally valued at \$12,398.00 by the Federal Government, was acquired for a service charge of approximately \$125.00. Organization officials estimate a savings of approximately \$2,000.00.

Pennsylvania State University (Centre County), acquired a cutoff band saw from the Program to use in their machine shop to replace an older machine. This particular machine shop does research in making heart valves. The saw, originally valued at \$5,723.00 by the Federal Government, was acquired for a service charge of approximately \$2,500.00. University officials estimate a savings of approximately \$17,200.00.

Jefferson Township (Lackawanna County), acquired a John Deere tractor from the Program to be used to stack piles of stone, loading a smaller truck, and mowing grass on the sides of Township-maintained roads. The tractor, originally valued at \$16,818.00 by the Federal Government, was acquired for a service charge of approximately \$3,000.00. Township officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of \$15,000.00.

Covington Township (Lackawanna County), acquired a light tower mounted on a trailer through the Program. The light tower will be used to aid the fire company in emergency situations and the police department to set up drunk driver checkpoints. The tower, originally valued at \$6,535.00 by the Federal Government, was acquired for a service charge of approximately \$2,000.00. Township officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of \$4,000.00.

Gulick Township (Clearfield), acquired a power lawn mower to use for maintenance around the Township and their recreation park. The mower, originally valued at \$16,048.00 by the Federal Government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$1,800.00. Township officials estimate their cost savings to the taxpayers at approximately \$2,000.00.

Pennsylvania Geological Society (Cumberland County), acquired three Pentium II laptop computers from the Program. These laptop computers will be used to maintain data statistics

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when the teams are in the field collecting data. The computers, originally valued at \$9,000.00 by the Federal Government, were acquired for a service charge of approximately \$30.00. Organization officials estimate a savings of \$420.00.

Indiana County Emergency Management Agency (Indiana County), acquired two light towers mounted on trailers from the Federal Surplus Program. These light trailers will be used to provide lighting in any county emergency. The light towers, originally valued at \$13,071.00 by the Federal Government, were acquired for a service charge of approximately \$4,000.00. County officials are estimating their savings at the break even point.

Pennsylvania State Police (Dauphin County), acquired a warehouse tractor from the Program. The tractor will be used to pull aircraft around in the State Police facilities. The tractor, originally valued at \$12,575.00 by the Federal Government, was acquired for a service charge of approximately \$1,100.00. PSP officials estimate the cost savings to the taxpayers at \$10,000.00.

Bloomsburg Township (Columbia County), acquired a light tower mounted on a trailer from the Program. The light tower will be used for checkpoint area and traffic control. The light tower, originally valued at \$6,535.00 by the Federal Government, was acquired for a service charge of approximately \$2,000.00. Township officials estimate a cost savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$2,000.00.
