From The Director's Chair

More information and sales listings will be made available in future issues. I look forward to seeing you at our first, indoor, rolling stock sale!

As you might imagine, there is a lot of planning here in Harrisburg for a potential budget impasse. In that unlikely event, you should be aware that we would be manned only by management and 2 union employees to cover 5 warehouses. Federal Surplus and State Surplus operations would be completely closed. Only emergency shipments out of the Warehouse and Distribution Division would be possible. Come on down and stock up now!!!

Scott Pepperman, Jerry Vaux, and I attended a town hall meeting last week at the Mechanicsburg DRMS (Defense Reutilization Marketing Service). The Federal Government is consolidating its warehousing and logistics centers all over the United States. Bad news – there will likely be little to no screening of surplus property at impacted sites in our region. Good news – the consolidation point for our region will be Mechanicsburg. This puts us in a potentially enviable position at least in terms of ease of screening and transportation. Check out Scott's column for all the details.

Our Finance/Data Manager, Stuart Mosebey, is putting the finishing touches on a business case (proposal), which, if approved, would permit us to accept Visa and MasterCard at all Federal and State Surplus locations. I am told that this will include Purchasing Cards, now wildly popular with many municipalities. Stay tuned for further details.

Last week, I attended a meeting downtown regarding our website. It seems that Governor Rendell and DGS Secretary Creedon are both pushing for a website redesign. The goals are: a common look; modular construct; ability to link to other enterprise applications; and the ability for customers to personalize their own portal (remove and add links and features that you use most). This presents some very interesting possibilities and I am glad for the opportunity to modernize our web pages. I will keep you posted on developments.

Finally, please join me in saying "Good-bye" to Mandy Terry. Mandy was my assistant and left the Bureau recently to join Property Management downtown. We thank her for her service and wish her the best of luck. Note that Kendra Lebo of the Bureau of Engineering and Architecture has accepted our offer to fill the position and will be starting on July 5th. Doings and Happenings

After returning from our Western Heavy Equipment Public Auction for PennDOT, I am extremely happy to report that this has been our most successful auction to date. We still have a few bugs to work out here and there, but we are gaining some positive in-roads on a consistent basis. This sale was open to the public, and a few municipalities still took advantage of the sale winning some of the bids. Overall, municipalities and public combined, the sale resulted in a gross revenue of approximately **\$1,250,000**.

DOD Consolidates and Closes Property Depots!

Recently, the Department of Defense (DOD) bid a new contract to handle their disposal of excess Federal property. Included in this contract is the closure of a number of their current property depots across the United States. The winning bidder elected to close about 75% of these depots, beginning this spring and finishing by the end of June 2006. **Nearly 75% of the property received by the Pennsylvania Federal Surplus Property Program comes from DOD through the depots known as Defense Reutilization and Marketing Organizations (DRMOs).** In order to keep Pennsylvania donees at the forefront of Property utilization, we will maintain and strengthen our current contacts at the closing DRMOs; be aggressive in seeking out the property you need; and attend "Town Hall" meetings at the affected DRMOs to learn more about DOD's new process. We will continue to update you regarding the effect of these changes on your Program and how you can help us to keep the property flowing into our Commonwealth.

Auction Blowout!

As a reminder, the Federal Surplus Program will also be involved in the Auction Blowout scheduled for August 28, 2006. Approximately 100 lots of property that were not donated through our Federal Program will be auctioned off to the highest bidder. A variety of items will be available, ranging from food service equipment, to building supplies and much more. Cen-Clear Child Services, Inc (Clearfield County), acquired a 1993 Acura Legend four door sedan to be used in support transportation for the children served by their rural programs. The sedan, originally valued at \$4050.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$2,800.00. Organization officials estimate a cost savings of approximately \$4,000.00.

Moon Township (Allegheny County), acquired two light towers, powered by diesel fuel and mounted on trailers, to be used at night in emergency situations. The light towers, originally valued at \$6,600.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$4,000.00 total. Township officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$7,000.00.

Pennsylvania Department of Corrections (Cumberland County), acquired a tractor mower to use for maintaining and cutting the grounds of their institution. The mower, originally valued at \$5,770.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$1,800.00. Department officials estimate a savings to Pennsylvania taxpayers of approximately \$8,200.00.

Neshanock Township Volunteer Fire Company (Lawrence County), acquired three (3) light towers mounted on a trailer through the Program. The towers will be used for night time search and recovery efforts. The towers, originally valued at \$19,800.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$6,000.00. Fire Company officials estimate saving approximately \$16,000.00 for their supporters and tax payers.

Regional Trail Corporation (Westmoreland County), acquired four (4) Cushman utility vehicles to be used as parts for vehicles they already acquired. The vehicles, originally valued at \$16,332.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$350.00. Officials estimate a minimum savings for the parts that were useable.

Pennsylvania Department of Corrections (Cumberland County), acquired several work stations for use in various areas including inmate training, administrative offices, and entry areas. The work stations, originally valued at \$8,000.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$600.00. Department officials estimate a savings of approximately \$10,000 to the Commonwealth taxpayers.

Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (Dauphin County), acquired five (5) light towers mounted on trailers to be used for night crews working on road paving throughout the State. The towers, originally valued at \$33,000.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$10,000.00. Department officials estimate a savings to Commonwealth taxpayers of approximately \$25,000.00.

Montgomery County Sheriff's Office (Montgomery County), acquired seven (7) 9 mm pistols through the Federal Surplus Program directly from the Federal government. These pistols will be used by the officers for target practice on the firing range. The pistols, originally valued at \$4,375.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$245.00. Sheriff's officials estimate a savings of approximately \$1,925.00 for their taxpayers.

Pennsylvania Department of Corrections (Cumberland County), acquired a large number of recreation bleachers which will be used for inmate activities inside the institution. These bleach-

ers, originally valued at \$29,900.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$2,500.00. Department officials estimate a savings to the Commonwealth taxpayers of approximately \$27,000.00.

Pennsylvania Department of Corrections (Cumberland County), acquired a large number of parking lot lights and poles to be used for additional lighting around the parking lots at the institutions. The lights and poles, originally valued at \$60,900.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$1,800.00. Department officials estimate a taxpayer savings of approximately \$58,000.

Snyder County Emergency Services (Snyder County), acquired three Pentium III laptop computers to be used for training emergency personnel in forecasting future emergencies. The laptops, originally valued at \$7,200.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$385.00. County officials estimate a savings of approximately \$5,000.00 to their taxpayers.

Lock Haven City (Clinton County), acquired a riding commercial lawn mower to use at the local airport for their flight control office. The mower, originally valued at \$18,864.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$850.00. The City officials estimate a cost savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$4,000.00.

Harrisburg Area Community College (Dauphin County), acquired a wood working surfacer that they will use as part of their construction program. The surfacer, originally valued at \$26,987.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$525.00. College officials estimate their cost savings to be approximately \$25,000.00.

Pittsburgh City Emergency Management Agency (Allegheny County), acquired six (6) hand-held radios that will be used to supplement emergency workers during this year's Baseball All-Star Game. The radios, originally valued at \$17,286.00 by the Federal government were acquired for a service charge of only \$150.00. EMA officials estimate a cost savings to the City of Pittsburgh taxpayers of approximately \$17,000.00.

Wayside Christian School (Montgomery County), acquired a small load of free standing partitions and some of the needed hardware which will be used for their classrooms and guidance counselors. The partitions, originally valued at \$58,700.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$40.00. School officials estimate a cost savings of approximately \$1,000.00.

Pennsylvania Department of Corrections (Cumberland County), acquired an engine lathe which will be used in the prison shop to make parts for repairs in the prison or to other prison machines. The machine, originally valued at \$15,500.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$500.00. Department officials estimate the savings to the Commonwealth taxpayers to be approximately \$20,000.00.

McCandless Township Sanitary Authority (Allegheny County), acquired a lathe to use for cutting pipe shafts for other presses in their shop. The lathe, originally valued at \$5,404.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$500. Authority officials estimate a cost savings to their customers of approximately \$5,000.00.

Lebanon County Emergency Management Agency (Lebanon County), acquired two (2) Pen-

tium III laptops to be used for their emergency rescue vehicles to list hazardous situations such as chemical spills and their consequences and remedies. The laptops, originally valued at \$4,800.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$190.00. EMA officials estimate a savings to the County taxpayers of approximately \$1,600.00.

Pennsylvania Department of Corrections (Cumberland County), acquired a truck load of kitchen equipment and furniture which will be used at the Rockview SCI. The furniture, originally valued at \$60,900.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$1,800.00. Department officials estimate a savings to the taxpayers of \$100,000.00.

Newtown Township Police Department (Bucks County), acquired a fingerprint scanner which will be used in the crime lab to fingerprint prisoners for evidence. The scanner, originally valued at \$23,040.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$81.25. Police Department officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$15,000.00.

Bethesda Day Treatment Center, Inc (Northumberland County), acquired an LCD Projector and two (2) Hewlett Packard workstations for use in their offices and to serve troubled youth. The equipment, originally valued at \$19,000.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$700.00. Center officials estimate their cost savings to the Program to be approximately \$2,000.00.

Northern Lehigh School District (Lehigh County), acquired 12 rotary chairs to be used as replacement chairs for secretaries and teachers throughout the School District. The chairs, originally valued at \$4,500.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$330.00. School officials estimate a savings to the taxpayers of the District of approximately \$600.00.

Wilkes-Barre Township (Luzerne County), acquired two (2) light towers mounted on trailers that will be used for traffic control and giving additional lighting to dark intersections. The towers, originally valued at \$13,071.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$4,000.00. Township officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$14,000.00.

Pittsburgh City Emergency Management Agency (Allegheny County), acquired two (2) Pentium II laptop computers which will be used to supplement the training and operations of their remote personnel. The laptops, originally valued at \$4,800.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$490.00. EMA official estimate a savings to the taxpayers of Pittsburgh of approximately \$3,000.00.

West Deer Township (Allegheny County), acquired five (5) Pentium laptop computers to be used for their office staff and for the code enforcement office. These computers, originally valued at \$12,000.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$915.00. Township officials estimate a savings of approximately \$4,000.00 for their taxpayers.

Carroll Township Authority (Washington County), acquired a mobile trailer to use for their water authority, as well as daily operations and maintenance. The trailer, originally valued at \$13,000.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$1,200.00. Authority officials estimate a cost savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$5,000.00.
