Jerry works in Federal Surplus as our vehicle specialist and has 15 years of service. Jerry is well known for his heavy equipment prowess and sense of humor. Lee Campbell only recently joined our Bureau, but has 34 years of service. Lee works in the Warehouse & Distribution Division here at Forster Street and is our primary support person for the Property Management Storeroom. Lee is also our resident softball expert. Another Forster Street employee, Bill Beattie, with a whopping 35 years of service will be checking out of his customer service duties in June. Bill enjoys traveling (especially to Disney sites) and classic cars. Please join me in extending my thanks, appreciation for both their hard work and wisdom, and wishes for good health and a long, happy retirement to them all.

Mini-Blowout It would be very difficult to match or surpass the success that we enjoyed with last year's Auction Blowout. So, we are not going to try... too hard. Mark your calendars now to set aside 7/18 for some auction fun. We will once again be at the Farm Show (Main Hall this time) to offer commercial laundry and kitchen equipment from the former Harrisburg State Hospital in the morning. The afternoon is reserved for a really nice collection of jewelry, electronics, and some high end vehicles (Impala SS, Lexus, Cadillac CTS, Yukon Denali, Harley Electra Glide, Yamaha snowmobile & ATV, etc). Happy ending (*Good news*) – The Fed's are beginning to loosen up their hold on surplus Katrina Relief mobile homes. We have received our first allocation of six units from Cumberland, MD and they look every bit as nice as the RV's that we have been shipping. We have processed approximately 140 travel trailers so far. There is still time for you to get on the list. (*Bad news*) – CBS Evening News reported on Wed, 5/16 that some (Gulf Stream Coach) Katrina Relief campers are making inhabitants sick. Everybody knows that new car smell, right? Well turns out that trailers and mobile homes have it too. It comes from outgassing of formaldehyde used to pre-serve adhesives. So, the more particle board and plywood, the more smell. Some folks (asthma, kids, elderly) are more prone to irritation. (*Happy ending*) – Fortunately, we have only

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processed 14 of the Gulf Stream Coach campers and 10 of those are in our possession.

Even better, FEMA was right on top of this. They had a study done just months ago by the Department of Health which found that simply ventilating the campers for four days would reduce formaldehyde levels by 75%. We will be sending a formaldehyde fact sheet to every camper and mobile home past and future donee (not just Gulf Stream Coach). We will offer testing to those four donees who have already taken possession of Gulf Stream Coach trailers and will perform random testing on an ongoing basis. We are ventilating trailers that come through us (but donees will need to ventilate units which are dropped shipped). Rancho Durango We will very shortly be taking possession of low mileage Dodge Durango SLT 4x4 via the Fixed Price Vehicle program. Jerry says that this vehicle is in such good shape, he could not bear to see it go to public auction. So, we have put our money down and are bringing it home for some lucky Federal Surplus donee to pick up at a very good price. Now the only question remains is how long it is going to last. I am taking 10 days in the pool. Check out Scott Pepperman's Fixed Price Vehicle column for all the details. (Hot Tip: remember that you can put any Federal Surplus on hold for 5 days while you get permission from your board).

Looks like we're on schedule for yet another summer auction. Mark Wednesday, July 18th on your calendars and bring a cool drink with you since it's going to be a hot one. This time, you'll be able to find us in the Main Hall at the Farm Show Building and Asset Auctions will be conducting the sale. Make sure you register on their website to be included in any mailings but I'll do my best to keep you posted on what's going on from here.

Originally, we were planning on offering merchandise from the D.G.S. Annex (formerly the Harrisburg State Hospital) but we've been approached by several agencies, PennDOT, DPW, Labor & Industry, and yes, the Attorney General once again. There will literally be hundreds of lots and the sale will start promptly at 9am (preview is reserved from 7am-8:30am on the day of the sale). Seized vehicles, tires, cell phones, and sound equipment will be offered from the Attorney General. The D.G.S. Annex will offer kitchen and laundry equipment, lawn maintenance, and other "antique-type" merchandise. DPW will have their usual share of furniture, desks, etc. and L&I will offer more kitchen/snack bar equipment. More to come on this from upcoming issues.

Keep your eyes peeled on Asset Auctions for more Right-of-Way offerings coming up. The William Penn Restaurant on Rt. 22 in New Florence will be going up for sale in late June / early July. Beautifully maintained bar and restaurant equipment. More to come next month when the list is finalized after settlement. We will also be scheduling some used vehicles for sale from Yurchison's Auto Sales off of the Golden Mile in Monroeville later this summer.

Requirements to be eligible to receive a travel trailer or mobile home from FEMA are as follow:

1. Your agency **must** be a current donee organization approved by GSA rules and regulations to receive Federal Surplus Property. Please email our office to make sure your files are current.
2. Contact your governing body to make sure you have approval to acquire one or more of these units.
3. Send a correction letter if you desire more or less units than your original request.
4. Know where you want the unit dropped by the trucking company.
5. You must put the unit into use within 12 months for the purpose of your organization only, no personal or commercial use is allowed and keep it in use for the 18 month restriction period at which time the title transfers to the donee organization.
6. We will bill your agency for the handling charges and any shipping costs.

Yes, there is still time to get on the want list for trailers and mobile homes if your agency has a need. Please go to our website, www.dgs.state.pa.us and look for the FEMA Trailer Update, you can print the Trailer Request and fax to us at 717-772-2491, attn: Ms. Mary Beth Enggren. Please do not swamp our telephone lines with request, use this convenient form and fax it to us.

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“What is the handling charge and transportation costs for these units?”

Pennsylvania has been receiving Travel Trailers from all over the county, from six different states already; however, we can't predict how many we will get from each location.

Pennsylvania has a large request list; however, our goal is to donate to every one of these requests if the units become available to us, but this will take time. We will contact you by email or telephone when we know the units are available. JUST PLEASE BE READY, and remember we will contact you.

Please consider joining the \$35.00 NASASP Associate Membership and help us defend the donation program. If your organization is interested in continuing to support us in our efforts to make events like this issue of FEMA trailers and mobile homes, contact our office for an Associate Membership Application.

FEMA **Travel Trailers** Service and Handling Charge will be \$4,500.00. Pennsylvania will not know the width or length until the units are awarded to us and they vary at each FEMA site. The donee can deny the property when contacted.

NOTE: Pennsylvania will call or e-mail each donee when their units are available. There will not be a chance to select from those units available due to FEMA only allowing 10 working days from award to Pennsylvania and delivery to the donee. We will work from your survey and can adjust to your needs when we contact you for delivery confirmation. You may refuse an offering when we call, **but not when the Travel Trailer is being delivered.**

NOTE: This Service Charge includes the Administrative Handling Charge and Freight from the screening site to your physical location.

NOTE: This DOES NOT INCLUDE setting on site or set up charges. The donee is responsible for that after unit is delivered to your location.

We will bill from your signed invoice the same as other donated property. You must put the unit into operation within a year and utilize it for 18 months for the intended purpose and may dispose of the trailer as your rules and regulations dictate.

FEMA **Mobile Home** Service and handling Charge will be \$8,000.00. We will try to match your requested mobile home length if possible. The donee can deny the property when contacted.

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- NOTE:** We will call or e-mail each donee when their units are available. There **will not** be a chance to select from those units available due to FEMA only allowing 10 working days from award to us and delivery to the donee. We will work from your survey and can adjust to your needs when we contact you for delivery confirmation. You may refuse a Mobile Home when we call, **but not when the item is being delivered.**
- NOTE:** This Service and Handling Charge includes the Administrative Handling Charge and Freight from screening site to your organization.
- NOTE:** This **DOES NOT INCLUDE** setting on site or set up charges. The donee is responsible for that after unit is delivered to your location.

We will bill from your signed invoice the same as other donated property. You must put the unit into operation within a year and utilize it for 18 months for the intended purpose and may dispose of the trailer as your rules and regulations dictate.

Items Recently Acquired by Your Neighbors!

Springfield Township (Bucks County) was our first recipient of a mobile home from FEMA and through our Federal Surplus Property Program; the mobile home will be used to house Emergency Services personnel during on call situations. The original cost to the Federal government for this item was \$50,000.00; however the Township was able to acquire this mobile home, delivered to their facility for a total of just \$8,000.00. Please see sample pictures of these mobile homes in our featured article about the FEMA property in this issue. Township officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$17,000.00 with this acquisition.

Westmoreland County Airport Authority (Westmoreland County) was one of the first recipients of FEMA travel trailers through our Program. The travel trailer will be used for onsite projects at their two airports to house engineers who are working on location, using it as an office. The travel trailer originally cost the Federal government \$20,000.00 but the Authority was able to acquire it for a service charge of just \$4,500.00. Authority officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$7,000.00.

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Amity Township (Erie County) recently acquired two Pentium III laptop computers from the Program which will be used for the Township office and accounting. These computers originally cost the Federal government \$4,962.68, but the Township was able to acquire both computers for a total service and handling fee of just \$262.50. Township officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$1,000.00.

Moon Township Volunteer Fire Company, Inc (Allegheny County) just acquired one of the FEMA travel trailers through the Program which will be used as a portable command center since it can be hauled with a ¾ ton truck. It will also be used as a communications center since this Fire Company is located closest to the Pittsburgh International Airport. The travel trailer originally cost the Federal government \$18,000.00 but the Volunteer Fire Company was able to acquire it for a service charge of only \$4,500.00. Fire Company officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$7,000.00.

Cen-Clear Child Services, Inc (Clearfield County) recently acquired 28 padded office chairs from the Program which will be used throughout their offices in two different counties for employees. The original cost to the Federal government for these chairs was \$5,600.00, but the donee was able to acquire all of the chairs from our Program for a service and handling charge of just \$336.00. The organization officials estimate a savings to their customers of approximately \$3,100.00.

Shohola Township (Pike County) just acquired a travel trailer from the Program which will be used year round as a Township emergency response vehicle, possible evacuation of residences, and a mobile command center and for the park engineer. The original cost to the Federal government for this item was \$14,000.00 but the Township was able to acquire it for just \$4,500.00. Township officials estimate a cost savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$7,000.00.

Pennsylvania Department of Corrections Acquires Maintenance Vehicles.

As I have mentioned several times in this article, state and local prisons can acquire items for institutional use. Recently, the **Pennsylvania Department of Correction (Cumberland County)** acquired two 1994 crew cab cargo trucks, all wheel drive. These vehicles will be used for both maintenance and security rounds. The Federal government acquired both of these vehicles for a total cost of \$31,400, but the Department of Corrections acquired them from the Program for a total service and handling charge of just \$3,600.00. Department officials estimate an approximate savings to Commonwealth taxpayers of \$10,000.00.

Property Recently Acquired by Your Neighbors...

Allegheny County Corrections (Allegheny County) recently acquired an Itemiser3 Contraband Detections and ID System from the Pennsylvania 1122 Program. This System will be used to screen employees coming and leaving work for contraband and drugs. The total cost of this System to the County was \$39,259.00. County Prison officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$6,500.00 by acquiring the equipment through the 1122 Program.

Scott Township Police Department (Lackawanna County) just acquired a 2007 Ford Expedition from the Program which will be used to patrol and respond in their mountainous areas and to perform mountainous rescue. The total cost for the Township for this new vehicle was \$21,520.12, delivered to the Township. Police Department officials estimate an approximate savings of \$4,000.00 to their taxpayers by using the 1122 Program.
