BRIDGING CUSTOMER NEEDS

***** FLASH NEWS *****

Please be advised that we have received a report of a potential scam wherein the seller is being offered surplus property from an organization in Harrisburg. The caller attempts to push the recipient into authorizing a purchase during the phone call. These calls do NOT originate from this Bureau and you are advised to attempt to verify the origin of the caller and if questionable, contact your local authorities or the Office of the Attorney General.

In the spirit of the holidays, we are taking the wraps off of our new surplus bridge website. PennDOT often has bridges on the National Register of Historic Places or eligible for inclusion or locally significant structures which need to be removed in order to permit an upgraded structure or revised road path to be put into use. Federal law prescribes that the historic structures must be offered to local municipalities. As such, we have devised this website as one means to communicate surplus bridge availability, facilitate the transition process, and to celebrate successful relocations.

The website details the process to be followed for offering and accepting bids. There are links to reference documents including a simple letter of interest, the Commonwealth's special terms and conditions associated with transfer of bridge ownership, a sample formal offer letter, and a sample sales contract.

This is followed by a page with bridges currently available for bidding. There is also a link to bridges being offered by municipalities. While the state has no jurisdiction, we are simply assisting the local organizations find a buyer with needs that are best met by one of their bridges.

There is a page devoted to relocation projects currently underway. This is followed by a page highlighting completed projects. Contacting those involved in current and past relocation projects can serve as a benchmark and useful source of information for those interested in undertaking a similar project.

We capped the site with a help tool. This includes the library of forms and sample documents, contact information for Commonwealth engineering and permitting resources, and links to outside private companies which have unique capabilities to assist in these types of projects.

I want to apologize to our faithful eBay customers for the recent interruption in postings from November 13th – December 1st. Most of you know that eBay introduced a new, confidential 5-star rating system on October 23rd.

This was put in place in addition to the existing open postings of buyer feedback. Well, a few unhappy buyers sent us a harsh message by giving us a low rating for shipping cost during the prior 30 day period. As our rating fell below the prescribed 4.1 minimum (scale 1-5), we were prevented from placing any new postings.

Of course, the problem is that without the ability to put up new postings, it is nearly impossible to bring up your rating. Since the ratings are anonymous, it is very difficult to identify who is unhappy or specifically why. This situation prompted eBay's largest seller, Bargainland (500,000 postings annually), to move to a new site. We contacted all our buyers during the period to ascertain the root cause of their ratings. Based on the feedback we were able to glean via direct contact, we were able to correct the perceived shortcomings and restore service. In addition, we are herewith announcing the cessation of handling fees for all our eBay shipments. While this practice, made sense to repay the Commonwealth for its' labor and supplies, it does not conform to our competitor's practices and placed our viability in jeopardy. Repayment will now have to come out of sales proceeds. While we are back in eBay's graces for the short term, we are also investigating alternative sites and alternative shipping methodologies to lessen our on-going exposure.

Congratulations to the Warehouse and Distribution Division on landing a new customer – PEMA! Looks like we will be assisting PEMA by receiving, inspecting, storing, and shipping educational materials for a new public program. New customers help to fill empty space in our warehouse and drive down everyone costs. Thanks to PEMA and to the Division staff who estimated the job and brought it home for the holidays.

I also need to congratulate the Federal Surplus Division on their recent physical inventory. We ended up with a confirmed inventory accuracy of 98.94%. Not quite as close to perfection as previous years, but nothing to sneeze at. Thank you to our customers for their patience during the days that we were closed to conduct the counts.

Check out Joe's column regarding the recent completion of the self-service kiosks in the State Surplus store. These are available to permit customers without access to the internet, to view and bid on our eBay and Asset-Auctions electronic auction offerings.

Finally, I want to point out the recent announcement by the Governor regarding elimination of planned cost-of-living increases. I understand the need for the action and fully support it. As such, it is now more important than ever to recognize exceptional effort and to at least publicly acknowledge it. Over my four years, I have received hundreds of emails from our customers doing just that. And I want to thank you all for providing the feedback. Recently, the Governor's Office sent us a notice about the Governor's Awards for Excellence. Turns out there is a formal program to nominate employees or groups of up to 10 people for "... accomplishments that reflect initiative, leadership, increased efficiency, and a strong commitment to service". If you believe that any of my employees, group of employees, or divisions embodies those attributes, then may I respectfully suggest you take the time to fill out a nomination form to share your recognition? Nomination forms are to be presented to DGS Human Resources Department (RA-GSHumanResources@state.pa.us).

As a courtesy during this period, State Surplus will waive all handling fees through the month of December.

We were recently made aware of the sale of Asset Auctions, our current auctioneer on contract, to SalvageSale, Inc. SalvageSale primarily deals with selling assets for the insurance industry and apparently both companies have identified synergies. Both of these companies are members of AssetNation, Inc., a consortia of auction websites. Good news for the Commonwealth in my opinion. This will further promote even more buyers to be exposed to our assets in hope of returning even more revenue to the Commonwealth. I have also been assured for at least the timebeing, that none of Asset Auctions' personnel will change.

ITEMS RECENTLY ACQUIRED BY YOUR NEIGHBORS!

- **Flourtown Fire Company (Montgomery County)** recently acquired a travel trailer from the Federal Surplus Property Program which will be retrofitted and modified into a collapse rescue maze and an SCBA trainer. It will be used to train the volunteers as well as those from many surrounding communities. The Federal government originally acquired this trailer for an acquisition cost of \$18,814.64, but the Fire Company was able to acquire the trailer from the Program for a service and handling charge of just \$1,850.00. Fire Company officials estimate a savings of approximately over \$30,000 compared to the cost of a new trailer. Their volunteers are donating their time and skills to modify the trailer to better prepare for emergency situations.
- **South Beaver Volunteer Fire Department (Beaver County)** just received a travel trailer from the Program which will be used when a search detail is required away from their home base, it will then become a command center. It may also be used on a temporary basis for families burned out of their homes until a shelter can be provided. The Federal government originally paid an acquisition cost for this trailer of \$18,500.00 but the Fire Department was able to acquire this trailer for a service and handling fee of only \$1,850.00. Fire Department officials estimate a savings for their taxpayers of approximately \$16,000.00.
- **Free Gospel Bible Institute (Westmoreland County)** recently acquired three travel trailers from the Program which will be used to house students on their campus due to a shortage of dormitory rooms for married couples. The Federal government originally acquired these three trailers for a total cost of \$56,443.92, but the school was able to acquire them for a total service and handling charge of just \$5,550.00. School officials estimate a savings to their students of approximately \$35,000.00.
- **Regional Trail Corporation (Westmoreland County)** just received an engine lathe and office supplies through the Program which will be used to make small parts to repair the Trail machinery and in the case of the office supplies for general office use. The Federal government originally paid a total acquisition cost for these items of \$15,500.00 but the Corporation was able to receive the items for a total service and handling fee of \$500.00. Corporation officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$1,650.00.
- **Elverson Emergency Medical Services, Inc (Chester County)** recently acquired an artillery shop shelter and 8 Toshiba laptop computers from the Program. The shelter will be used for a storage shed for their facility and the computers will be used for their business operation of the organization, training for members and other general uses. The Federal government originally paid a total acquisition for all of these items of \$106,000.00, but the Medical Services was able to acquire the items for a service and handling charge of just \$2,300.00. Medical Services officials estimate a cost savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$3,000.00.
- **Fairview Township (York County)** recently acquired a travel trailer through the Program which will be used for training for their fire service volunteers. The Federal government originally paid an acquisition cost for this trailer of \$18,814.64, but the Township was able to acquire it for a service and handling fee of only \$1,850.00. Township officials estimate a cost savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$25,000.00.
- **Vietnam Huey Pilots Association (Allegheny County)** just received 25 aircraft turbine disks through the Federal Surplus Property Program which will be used as consumable items to operate their Huey Helicopter for the museum, a T53 engine. The Federal government originally paid a total service charge for these disks of \$98,397.25, but the museum was able to acquire these disks for a service and handling fee of only \$4,875.00. Museum and Association officials estimate a cost savings to their constituents of approximately \$45,000.00.
