Surplus mobile home provides "Relief" in Duquesne A mobile home originally purchased for Hurricane Katrina 'relief' is now providing 'leaky roof relief' for the Duquesne EMS. Here is a copy of the press relief which details how one of our donees is making good use of the surplus mobile home they recently received:

Federal, State and Local Officials band together to help ambulance service

Duquesne EMS faced a future of uncertainty until Federal, State and Local Officials intervened to help the ambulance service. The station had develop a series of severe leaks causing the crews to run for tarps and buckets each time it rained to protect both the crews and vital equipment from the water which was pouring into the base.

The City of Duquesne which owned the building placed the roof repair and replacement out to bid only to be told that the building was on the "take list" for the new Mon-Fayette expressway project and such an investment would be a poor decision.

With the ceiling on the company's office space collapsed, and mold forming from the water which poured in, the service would have to build a new base, but the problem arose of where to house the crews until such time.

With State Senator Sean Logan spearheading the project to help the service find a temporary base and help from United States Senator Robert Casey, United States Congressman Mike Doyle, Lt. Govenor Catherine Baker Knoll, FEMA, PEMA, the Pennsylvania Department of Health, The Department of General Services, The Emergency Medical Services Institute, and extensive assistance from The City of Duquesne the service is pleased to invite you to the dedica-

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tion of our new mobile home which will serve as the company's temporary base of operations.

Doings and Happenings

A quick follow-up to our most successful Municipal Heavy Equipment Auction from last Spring. Don't forget that we MAIL titles directly to municipalities for all "Sell by Picture" items. We had some folks confused last year thinking that they could pick up the title with the keys at the location. We also recently sold an oil tank out of Pittsburgh that required special rigging, permits, and licensing. Be sure to read all terms and conditions before you bid, especially the detailed comments on each item.

PennDOT continues to "heat up" with more Right of Way property that they have asked D.G.S. to help sell – anything from mobile homes in Bridgeville, auto parts in York, and golfing equipment/maintenance in the Carlisle area. Additionally, we just sold restaurant equipment in New Florence at the William Penn Restaurant. We are also planning on having an auto dealership/parts available in Monroeville hopefully in the Fall. More to come on each of these R.O.W.'s in later Sampler issues.

We recently sold some bag and box manufacturing equipment for Correctional Industries out of SCI – Graterford. Although the process and pick up was challenging, we managed to exceed our expectations. Read below for more information.

Finally, we are entering the home stretch for the D.G.S. Farm Show Auction. Some of the finds at the former Harrisburg State Hospital will astonish you. For example, in a preliminary auction conducted online, we were able to generate revenue of over \$18,000 by simply offering almost 50 items – tractors, pool tables, sewing machines, and even a gym floor!!! FEMA Travel Trailer and Mobile Home Update!

To date, we have been allocated **211 FEMA Travel Trailers and over a dozen Mobile Homes**, with many more to come. In the month of June, we screened at two different sites to continue to meet your needs for these items. Please check out the success stories at the end of this month's articles to see how your neighbors are using their travel trailers or mobile homes!

Requirements to Receive a Travel Trailer or Mobile Home

- Your agency **must** be a current donee organization approved by GSA rules and regulations to receive Federal Surplus Property. Please email our office to ensure that your file is current.
- Obtain the approval of your governing body to acquire one or more of these units.
- Submit a corrected request and letter in order to change the number of units from your original request.
- Notify us of the anticipated location of your trailer/mobile home for direct shipment via the trucking company.
- As with all Federal Surplus Property, your organization must place the unit into use within 12 months; utilize the unit for your organization only - no personal or commercial use is allowed; and utilize the property for the 18 month restriction period, at which time the title transfers to the donee organization.
- Federal Surplus will bill your agency for the service charges and any shipping costs.
- Your agency can still place a request for trailers and/or mobile homes. Please visit our website, www.dgs.state.pa.us and look for the FEMA Trailer Update. Print the Trailer Request and fax to us at 717-772-2491, attn: Ms. Mary Beth Enggren. **Please do not swamp our telephone lines with requests**, use this convenient form and fax it to us.

Pennsylvania already has an extensive request list for trailers and mobile homes. Our goal is to meet every request as the units become available to us, but this process will take time. FEMA releases the trailers, and GSA allocates them to the various State Agencies for Surplus Property. We will contact you by email or telephone when we know the units are available.

- PLEASE BE READY to provide all requested information when we contact you.

Travel Trailer and Mobile Home Specifics

- **Travel Trailers:** Service and Handling Charge is **\$4,500.00**. Pennsylvania will not know the width or length until the units are awarded to us. **Your organization can refuse to accept a trailer that will not meet your needs IF YOU REFUSE PRIOR TO MAKING DELIVERY/PICK UP ARRANGEMENTS.** Demo units are available for preview in Harrisburg and Hermitage. - **Mobile Homes:** Service and Handling Charge is **\$8,000.00**. We will try to match your requested mobile home length if possible. **Your organization can refuse to accept a mobile home that will not meet your needs IF YOU REFUSE PRIOR TO MAKING DELIVERY/PICK UP ARRANGEMENTS.** [Picture 1](#), [Picture 2](#), [Picture 3](#), [Picture 4](#), [Picture 5](#), [Picture 6](#), [Picture 7](#), [Picture 8](#), [Picture 9](#), [Picture 10](#), [Picture 11](#).

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- We will call or e-mail each donee as units are available. Your organization **will not** be able to select from those units available as FEMA allows only 10 working days from the award of the trailers and/or mobile homes to Pennsylvania to delivery to the donee. We will work from your survey and can adjust to your needs when we contact you for delivery confirmation.
- This charge includes the **Service Charge** and **Freight** from the screening site to your physical location.
- This charge **DOES NOT INCLUDE** siting or set up charges. The donee is responsible for those charges after delivery.
- We will bill from your signed invoice as with all donated property.

In the past, Pennsylvania donees have utilized these units for class rooms, offices, police command posts, emergency services, clinics, food and clothing distribution to the homeless and needy. As with all Federal surplus property, your imagination is your best tool!

We will review your application to ensure that we have all of the information that we need, and respond to you accordingly. Once your online application has been approved, we will hold it as "pending" until you mail in needed attachments

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and the application with the original signature. When this additional information is received it will be a matter of a day or two to have the file set up and an e-mail back to your organization congratulating you on becoming a part of one of Pennsylvania's greatest secrets, the Federal Surplus Property Program!

Equipment Recently Acquired by Your Neighbors...

Pennsylvania Department of General Services (Dauphin County) acquired a 10,000 lb capacity Hyster Forklift which will be used to move heavy material around the Capitol Complex and to load and unload building materials. The forklift, originally valued at \$31,587.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$3,750.00. Department officials estimate a savings to the Commonwealth taxpayers of approximately \$20,000.00.

Northern Tier Career Center (Bradford County) acquired a FEMA travel trailer which will be used as a construction trailer while they put a new expansion on their school. The trailer, originally valued at \$14,000.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$4,500.00. Center officials estimate a savings to their students of approximately \$7,000.00.

Hopewell Township (Beaver County) acquired a FEMA mobile home which will be used to augment their Water Pollution Control Plant that was lost in the aftermath of Hurricane Ivan in 2003. They are setting up a lunch room, two offices, storage and a small conference area. In addition the FEMA mobile home provides a much needed restroom. Since 2003, the Township has been renting a small work trailer for \$3,000 per year. The mobile home, originally valued at \$23,000.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$8,000.00. Township officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$17,000.00.

Emergency Medical Services Institute (Allegheny County) acquired a FEMA travel trailer which will be used to facilitate and enhance emergency field response. The trailer, originally valued at \$18,000.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$4,500.00. Institute officials estimate a savings to their organization of approximately \$7,000.00.

Duquesne Emergency Medical Services, Inc (Allegheny County) acquired a FEMA mobile home which will be used to house the EMS crew and management. Prior to receiv-

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ing this mobile home, the crew slept in a moldy building. The mobile home, originally valued at \$23,000.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$8,000.00. EMS officials estimate a cost savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$45,000.00.

Lancaster County Career and Technology Center (Lancaster County), acquired a load of miscellaneous furniture which will be used to create a reception area for the Day Care Center at the school. The chairs were used to furnish a classroom. The furniture, originally valued at \$6,965.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$50.00. School officials estimate a cost savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$1,700.00.

Indiana County Emergency Management Agency (Indiana County) acquired a FEMA travel trailer which will be converted into a mobile command vehicle by removing the beds and changing the rooms into offices. The trailer, originally valued at \$23,620.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$4,500.00. County officials estimate a cost savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$11,000.00.

Covington Township (Lackawanna County) acquired a portable air compressor which will be used for blowing out paving cracks and for sandblasting. The air compressor, originally valued at \$7,480.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$450.00. Township officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$100.00 for every time they had to rent an air compressor.

Pottsville City Housing Authority (Schuylkill County) acquired two FEMA travel trailers which will be used for office space and emergency housing when needed. The trailers, originally valued at \$36,000.00 by the Federal government, were acquired for a service charge of only \$9,000.00. Housing Authority officials estimate a savings for their taxpayer of approximately \$75.00 to \$100.00 every time they use it for an emergency, adding up to thousands of dollars annually.

Ferndale Borough (Cambria County) acquired a FEMA travel trailer which will be used as a command post in the event of a local emergency. Also, it will be available for other uses by the municipality. The trailer, originally valued at \$18,500.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$4,500.00. Borough officials estimate a cost savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$15,000.00.

Pond-Hill Lily Lake Volunteer Fire Company (Luzerne County) acquired a commercial refrigerator which will be used in their Fire Hall kitchen. The refrigerator, originally valued at \$16,250.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$500.00. Fire Company officials comment that they would not be able to afford a refrigerator of this size without using the Federal Surplus Property Program and savings approximately \$3,500.00.

Newtown Township Police Department (Bucks County) acquired a FEMA travel trailer which will be used as a mobile Command Post for the Police Department. The Police Department also has an active SERT team as well as a Major Incident Response Team. This piece of equipment will be invaluable when they have to respond to incidents, because they now have a secure place to interview or house victims, as well as using the trailer to conduct command personnel meetings. The trailer, originally valued at \$18,000.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$4,500.00. Police Department officials estimate a savings of approximately \$24,000.00 by using this Program.

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North Penn School District (Montgomery County) acquired a FEMA travel trailer which will be used as a mobile office for the district's Construction Manager. The trailer will allow him to house his materials and references in a single location that can be transported from job site to job site. The trailer, originally valued at \$18,500.00 by the Federal government, was acquired for a service charge of only \$4,500.00. School District officials estimate a savings to their taxpayers of approximately \$45,000.00.

New Items From Accuracy-One Drug Testing Supplies

Accuracy-One is now offering a 4-Panel **Combo drug test** that either tests as a "dip" kit or as a "cassette" kit. Each pouch contains a pipette with a marked fill line on its neck. Place that sample amount of specimen into the sample well to start the testing procedure as a cassette. To use this kit as a dip card, remove the clear cover over the well sample area and place the bottom of the kit into the collected sample. Immerse to just below the arrows. Results are seen between 4 to 7 minutes.

Accuracy-One is offering this kit through the 1122 Program at **\$1.89 each** with a minimum of 500 per order- freight is not included. It takes about 21 days from the date the order is received until it ships, as these kits are produced on an as-ordered basis.

The Salvation Army has tried this kit and is enthusiastic about the ease and accuracy in testing.
