PROJECTS APPROVED BY PEDA
MARCH 23, 2009
(from Press Release)

The five projects approved by PEDA include the following:

- Bridge Business Center LP in Bucks County will receive \$1 million to install an advanced energy system in a 50,000 square foot laboratory renovation that will enable them to recycle waste heat from their operations and meet all of their own energy needs. The company is investing \$1.6 million on top of the state's grant.
- In Cumberland County, roofing manufacturer Carlisle Syn Tech is investing \$650,000 and using a grant of the same amount to install an advanced 200 kilowatt solar system on its roof. The company aims to develop an integrated solar roofing product that can be marketed to large commercial and industrial customers.
- In Philadelphia, Sysco Food Services is constructing a 190,000 square foot expansion of its distribution center and warehouse there. With PEDA assistance, the expansion will be greener and more energy efficient facility by using energy conservation measures and tools that utilize the power of the sun. Sysco is matching the state investment of \$840,000.
- The Williamsport Hospital and Medical Center in Lycoming County will use a \$1 million state grant to help install a new 2 megawatt cogeneration system that will generate electricity and also capture and reuse waste heat to provide heat and hot water for the hospital. The hospital is matching the state investment with a \$1.7 million investment.
- Campus Square Partners in Dauphin County is installing a 50.5 kilowatt solar photovoltaic system on its 70,000 square foot building to help reduce energy costs and help the building will qualify for silver LEED certification. The \$13 million redevelopment is located at Third and Reilly streets. The \$281,000 in PEDA grant funding will go towards the cost of the solar installation and equipment.
