How PA Benefits	People Helped in Allegheny County	Explanation of Benefits
Food Assistance	136,563	Hungry children and adults will receive more help through the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (Food Stamps)
Health Insurance	191,662	Low income children and adults will continue to have access to health care through Medical Assistance
Health Insurance for Unemployed	47,300	Unemployed persons who could qualify for more help purchasing health insurance as of September 2009
Tax Relief	540,154	Taxpaying individuals and households - all but high earners qualify for taxpayer relief
Unemployment Compensation	36,600	Jobless adults who received a boost in Unemployment Compensation from February to October 2009
