**PennDOT Awards \$19.3 Million Transportation Economic Recovery Project to Improve Four Miles of Route 202 in West Goshen and Westtown Townships, Chester County**

**King of Prussia** – PennDOT District 6 today announced the award of a \$19,377,081 transportation economic recovery project for the rehabilitation and improvement of Route 202 in West Goshen and Westtown townships, Chester County.

Allan A. Myers, LP of Worcester, Montgomery County was awarded the federally-funded contract to upgrade 4.3 miles of Route 202 from the Route 100 Interchange to the intersection of High Street.

Crews will work over the next year to replace deteriorated concrete pavement and resurface the four-lane expressway; reinforce the roadway shoulders; patch and repair eight bridges; paint steel beams on three bridges; remove and replace five overhead sign structures; install new highway signs; install new guide rail and median barrier; and install safety rumble strips and pavement reflectors.

Construction is expected to start in June 2010 and finish in August 2011.

In the five-county Philadelphia region, PennDOT is investing \$257 million of federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funds on 30 transportation projects, which include road and bridge improvements, Intelligent Transportation System installations, traffic signal upgrades, multi-use trails, and curb ramp replacements.

PennDOT has awarded all 30 transportation economic recovery projects in the five-county Philadelphia region and 26 projects have moved to construction.
